'Tis the Season for a Sunny Burst of Flavour!

It's finally spring and time to enjoy a little more sunshine and lighter flavours. Sunburst Lemon Bars are the perfect thing to hit that sweet spot. Are these squares easy to make and absolutely delicious? Oh yes! Do they have sugar? Oh yes, but you can modify the icing or just enjoy a special sweet treat.

Prep: 15 mins | Cook: 60 minutes | Yield: 36 bars

INGREDIENTS

Crust

2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup powdered sugar

1 cup butter or margarine, softened

Filling

4 eggs, slightly beaten

2 cups sugar

1/4 cup all-purpose flour

1 tsp baking powder

1/4 cup lemon juice

Frosting

2 cups powdered sugar

6 tbsp lemon juice (or more as needed)



DIRECTIONS

Pre-heat oven to 350°F. In large bowl, combine all crust ingredients at low speed until crumbly. Press mixture evenly in bottom of ungreased 13' x 9' pan. Bake for 20 to 30 minutes or until light golden brown.

Meanwhile, in a large bowl combine all filling ingredients except lemon juice and blend well. Stir in 1/4 cup lemon juice. Pour mixture over warm crust.

Return to oven and bake an additional 25 to 30 minutes or until top is light golden brown. Cool completely.

In a small bowl, combine 1 cup powdered sugar and enough lemon juice for desired consistency for spreading. Blend until smooth. Spread over cooled bars.

Enjoy the season!

Leaning Into the Light

Spring mornings are best enjoyed in a warm sunny garden. Add a cup of coffee and it feels like heaven. Sipping my way along the flower beds like a detective, I search for evidence the perennials have made it through another winter. By mid-May, once the garden outline reappears, I happily settle into a feeling of relief and renewed expectation.

By then I have a fair idea what to include on my garden centre list. A combination of easy-care annuals and some new perennials to keep things interesting. Magically the sun, rain and mother nature's hand over many days together, bring forth a returning masterpiece in every bloom. But even beautiful flowers have their needs and wants.

Having spent many hours gardening over the years, I have noticed a correlation between plants and people's behaviour. Plants, like people, do best in an environment that meets their needs. Or adapt to where they live, losing something of their personality and beauty. One plant inparticular comes to mind: a deep pink peony relocated to the wettest part of the garden one fall. The following spring, it grew small and flowerless, and it got me thinking... was this in protest to being moved or simply in response to its unhappy lot?

I didn't know exactly what to do. Simply ignore the feeble specimen. Uproot and plant it somewhere else or try a new approach. I decided patience and faith was the best option. Thereafter each year the peony returned taller and more abundant than the year before. It's large pink blooms and glossy green leaves demanded more than a momentary glance to admire both the plant and the corner of the garden it now graced. How glad I was that I left the plant in charge of growing itself, with my support of course.

Many people, including myself, feel a bit fragile at times due to the disruptions and uncertainties in our day to day lives. Not so for the proud peony, now looking robust and healthy enough for me to take a couple of cuttings for propagation. So, I went into the garden and stood under a tree looking down at the plant, trying to decide how best to proceed. When I casually turned my head sideways and noticed a hosta about 10 feet away. Straight away I became aware that something was different. Its light purple flowers were bent and leaning towards the lawn and into the light. For me, the moment froze as I thought "that plant is reaching and bending for what it needs to stay alive and grow." It is leaning into the light and changing its shape, yet nothing was missing. Its green shiny leaves were lush and its flowers plentiful. For sure its shape was different, not as one



would expect. Yet it was complete in every respect except for its bent flowers, which would normally stand erect.

From another position on the lawn, the bent flowers were less noticeable than when viewed from under the trees. It made me think of how people change when they go through a tough time in their lives. When their needs are not being met. They put on a happy face while feeling sad inside.

They may seem normal when you meet them. But because you notice something's not quite right, you sit a little longer and become aware of the strain in their voice or their less joyful energy, bending towards a perceived solace in your presence. "They lean into the light of your awareness of them." How they feel matters and if only slightly, they feel better just being with you.

The hosta figured out how to reach the sunlight all on its own. But I expect a little work on my part to trim the tree and invite the light is the right move. Just as taking a short video for family and friends. Of climbing roses like a red waterfall, cascading from the side of my house. Or a robin's nest with four blue eggs, hidden under a pink clematis, as my way of saying I'm thinking of you. I hope you're well. I hope this makes you happy and just remember, when things get hard, lean into the light of the things you need and want and those already inside you too.

Like it...






